E-Safety

In school our pupils learn all about e-safety and acceptable behaviour online. They learn how to be good digital citizens, how to respect others online, what to do if they encounter negative or bullying behaviour online and how to use the power of their online voice for good. We believe that any pupil at our school, if asked how they should behave online, would be able to tell you.

Unfortunately, we are coming across more and more instances of pupils not putting this into practice outside of school and instead instigating or involving themselves in unacceptable and unkind behaviour online, mainly in chat groups.

Even though we try to educate the pupils in online etiquette, we wholeheartedly believe they are too young to use social media which includes chat groups such as WhatsApp. We believe that the negative online behaviour we are seeing just reinforces this. The minimum age for social media is 13 years and most experts now agree that even this is too young.

The final decision, is of course, up to you but if you make the decision to allow your child to use social media and encounter issues outside school we feel these should therefore be dealt with outside school by parents. We will, of course, offer support and guidance if you need it. Thank you for your continued support.
